Suitable for KS3 - KS5 Duration: 11 minutes

Their Future in Your Hands is a great new video resource, ideal for stimulating discussion about animal rights in subjects such as citizenship, English, RE and sixth form general studies. The film demonstrates that animals have rich emotional lives – in many ways similar to our own. It explores the various ways in which animals are used in society and encourages students to question our current relationship with the animal kingdom.

Rather than simply describing the suffering of animals in laboratories and factory farms, this is a film of hope, showing

Suitable for KS4 Duration: 20 minutes

The film follows four teenagers with very different views, as they ask hard-hitting questions about meat. Where does it come from? What is eating it doing to us, the animals and the environment? This film covers KS4 national curriculum targets in citizenship and English, and is also suitable for use in PSHE, religious studies and general studies.

Suitable for KS3 - KS5 Duration: 11 minutes

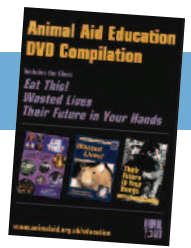

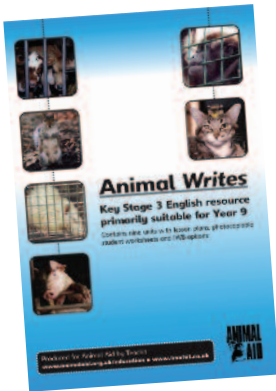
Wasted Lives

Suitable for KS4 and sixth form Duration: 20 minutes

This film puts the moral and scientific arguments against animal experiments. It covers KS4 national curriculum targets in citizenship, English and science, and is ideal for religious studies and general studies.

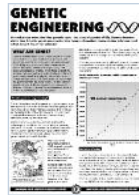

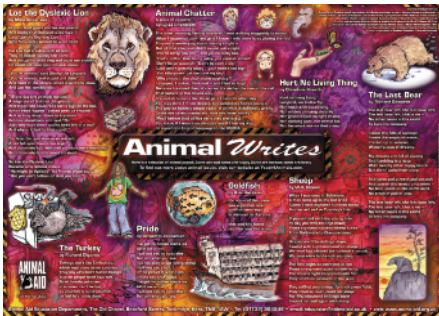

Information on vegetarianism Young Veggies

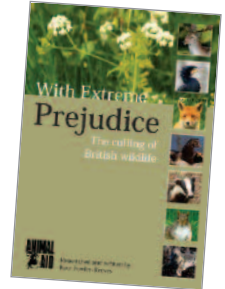

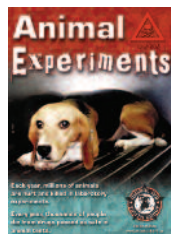
